There's a Place for You at St. Paul's!



For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: Ecclesiastes 3:12-13

This week, I decided it was finally safe to put the snow shovel away. At this point, I certainly hope we don't see anymore of that white stuff for many months! The season has dramatically changed in the last couple of weeks, and for many of us, it is a most welcome change.

The changes in our weather aren't the only seasons that we experience in our life. In fact, King Solomon wrote in Ecclesiastes that "for everything there is a season." I encourage you to read the whole chapter of Ecclesiastes 3 along with this article. Solomon gives many examples of "changing seasons" in that chapter. Here are a few examples: our life in its entirety is but a season in the greater concept of time. There is a planting season and a harvest season, times of sadness and times of laughter, seasons to save and store, and there are times to spend and **give**.

Summer is approaching fast, and for many of us, the warmer weather isn't the only change of season happening right now. We have one member in the church engaged to get married in the not-too-distant future (Cody, that would be you), and marriage begins a new season of life! Some of you may have family members expecting a baby, perhaps your grandchild. Some of you are entering into a time each year that is defined as "lake season" (weekends at one of our beautiful lakes). Some may have graduating seniors in your family who are ending this season of life and heading off to college in the fall, and some may know college seniors who are graduating and taking jobs – some close to home, and some in other places in the country. These are just a few of the ways that our lives change over the course of time, and these kinds of things happen all through life!

At the end of his list of seasons in Ecclesiastes 3, Solomon says that this is the business God has given to humankind and that God has made everything beautiful in its time. These kinds of changes are often wonderful, but there are also changing seasons that are painful and filled with sorrow. Those seasons can last days or weeks, months or even years! One of the main points of the book of Ecclesiastes is that God is in control through all these seasons of life and that God is good to us. It may not always look like it, but God sees things from a different angle, a better and eternal perspective, and God makes everything beautiful in its time!

Because of that, Solomon says in Ecclesiastes 3:12-13 that the best thing for humankind, in whatever we do in any season, is to be joyful, "do good" as long as we live, and take pleasure in our toil or work, whatever it is. Solomon says that this is God's gift to humankind. In other words, God's in control, so enjoy yourselves! Isn't that kind of a fun thought?!

Jim and I send our warm wishes to each of you, and we look forward to hearing about the successful sale you just pulled off!!





President's Report

Property Sale Update:

On April 7th, Church Council hosted an information meeting. After a review of a survey provided by the Carson City School District and a question-and-answer session with those present, a recommendation was made for the CCSD to continue to seek an appraisal of the two (2) acres of property. I contacted the superintendent to continue with the appraisal process. It may take 6-8 weeks to before we hear back from CCSD.

Annual and Budget Information Meeting:

Church Council has moved **St. Paul's Annual Meeting** to June 2, 2024 after church service. Normally, our annual meeting is on the second Sunday of June, however, the Sierra Pacific Synod Assembly is on June 7-9, 2024 and creates a conflict. Church Council has also scheduled a **Budget Information Meeting** for May 5th after the church service to answer any questions about the proposed budget for 2024-2025, which will be voted on at the Annual Meeting.

Last Sunday, two members volunteered to be on Church Council. There is still one more vacancy to be filled. The term of a council member is three (3) years. You must be a member of St. Paul's and your gifts and talents would be welcomed. Currently, Ken Beaton and Nakita Jones are on the nominating committee. If you would like to serve on the Church Council, please talk to one of them or feel free to contact me.

Annual Reports:

It is really important to have reports from committees and groups in our church in the Annual Report. The report does not have to be very long. A simple list of what happened this last year and who was involved is all that is needed. The report is due to Brette, our office manager, by May 15th, so she will have time to put everything together. The Annual Report will be very important for a new pastor. It will help them understand who we are and what happens in our community. To all those who are so involved in our church and its events, THANK YOU!



Mother's Day is a celebration honoring the mother of the family or individual, as well as motherhood, maternal bonds, and the influence of mothers in society. It is celebrated on different days in many parts of the world, most commonly in the months of March or May. It complements similar celebrations, honoring family members, such as Siblings Day, and Grandparents' Day.

While some countries have a multi-century history of a day to celebrate mothers, the modern American version of the holiday began in the United States in the early 20th century at the initiative of Anna Jarvis, who organized the first Mother's Day service of worship and celebration at St. Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, West Virginia, which serves as the International Mother's Day Shrine today. It is directly related to the many traditional celebrations of mothers and motherhood that have existed throughout the world over thousands of years, such as the Greek cult to Cybele, the mother deity Rhea, the Roman festival of Hilaria, or the other Christian ecclesiastical Mothering Sunday celebrations (associated with the image of Mother Church.)

However, in some countries, Mother's Day is still synonymous with these older traditions.





May Full Moon

May's full moon, called the **Flower Moon**, appears on Thursday, May 23rd, reaching peak illumination at 9:53 a.m. (EDT). It will be below the horizon at this time, so for the best view of this full moon, step outside on the night of the 23rd or the 24th and look for that big, bright, shining lunar disk!
