President's Report

This article is dedicated to communicating the actions, decisions, and future action items of the Church Council. It is intended to give the congregation the highlights of the Church Council meeting.

Christ Has Risen! He Has Risen Indeed!

Once again, I would like to thank the Youth Group and their leaders for the Easter Breakfast, Easter egg hunt, and visitations to those who have difficulty joining us in person. Their service to St Paul's is very much appreciated.

There are many in our congregation who are behind the scenes doing God's work with their hands. You know who you are and know that we appreciate everything you do!

On May 6th, we will be having a "Paint the Church Sign Party". As we were unable to find vendors to update the church sign at a reasonable cost, Council decided to host a party to refresh the signs with paint and a little bit of "elbow grease". Nikki Rohrs is heading this small project. Please contact her if you can help.

The small pickup truck donated to the church by the Elverum family was sold for \$1,200. At the request of Pastor Mike, council approved \$500 for an Easter radio ad. The remaining funds will be put into the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

The landscaping bid from Outdoor Expressions was approved at the April meeting. The cost for landscaping is approximately \$500-\$600 each month with lawns being mowed every other week and the monitoring of the irrigation system around the property. Additional trees are being donated to replace those that have died.

St. Paul's is facing a critical shortage of funds. We are barely making payroll and may need to transfer funds from savings. Our average income is \$11K for the past 12-months with our expenses averaging around \$15K each month. We are bleeding! I know we have lost many members and with them their contributions. Please consider increasing your offering if at all possible.

Council is preparing for the Annual Meeting on June 11th. We will consider a new budget, a proposed change in the time of Sunday services, election of new Council members, and a Call Committee report on the status of calling a Pastor. If you have other items for the agenda that you wish the congregation to consider, please let me know.

I ask the congregation to unite in prayer each night at 8:00 p.m.

Loving God, be with us and guide us during this time of discernment. Fill our leaders with your wisdom. Keep us mindful of the work you would have us do. Lead us and guide us O Lord to be about the work of your kingdom even as the search for a new pastor continues. Bless all who have taken on extra responsibility and fill them with a sense of your love and presence. We pray in your Son's name, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Our worship service is live-streamed via YouTube.

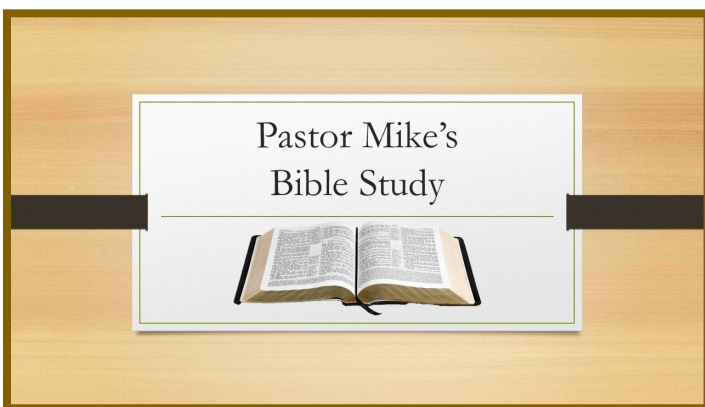

ASCENSION DAY celebrates Jesus's ascension to heaven after he was resurrected on Easter Day. A quotation from Mark 16:9-20 tells the story.

He appeared first to Mary of Magdala. She went and carried the news to his mourning and sorrowful followers, but when she told them that he was alive they did not believe her.

Later he appeared to two of the disciples as they were walking into the countryside. They also went and took the news to the others, but again they did not believe that the Lord was alive.

Then, when the eleven disciples were at the table, he appeared to them and reproached them because they had not believed those who had seen him after he was raised from the dead. Then he said to them: 'Go forth to every part of the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. Those who believe it and receive baptism will find salvation; those who do not believe will be condemned. Faith will bring with it these miracles: believers will cast out devils in my name and speak in strange tongues; if they handle snakes or drink any deadly poison, they will come to no harm; and the sick on whom they lay their hands will recover.'

So, after talking with them the Lord Jesus was taken up into heaven, and he took his seat at the right hand of God. Jesus's prophecy in this passage is believed to foreshadow the later events of Pentecost.

THE ASCENSION OF JESUS

⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' ⁷ He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' ⁹ When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹ They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.' Acts 1: 6-11

A Perfect Church?

Is there a perfect church? When faced with the question of why there are so many churches in the world, an answer, rhetorical in nature, has often times been given. "Can there be such a thing as a perfect church?" With literally thousands of denominated and divided churches, all with conflicts, controversy, finger pointing and fault-finding, caused by human imperfection, one wonders if it is even possible that a church could possibly be perfect.

When considering questions of a religious or spiritual nature, we should always go to God's word for the answer (2 Timothy 3:16-17). So does the bible describe a perfect church? We can begin with the description of the church found in Ephesians, Chapter 5. First, Christ is the Head of the church and Savior of the body (church), therefore, the church is subject to Him (v. 22-24). Next, verses 25-27 declare that Christ "loved the church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish." Christ died for the church, purchasing it with His blood (Acts 20:28). The same blood that washes away sin (1 John 1:7; 1 Cor. 6:11), and He has set it apart, cleansed it so it has no imperfections.

So, yes, there is a perfect church. It is the church built by Jesus Christ (Matthew 16:18), filled with spiritually saved people who have been added to it by the Lord Himself (Acts 2:47). ~ Jay Launius

PENTECOST

The day of Pentecost is noted in the Christian Church as the day on which the Spirit descended upon the apostles, and on which, under Peter's preaching, so many thousands were converted in Jerusalem as found in Acts 2. The significance of Pentecost is made clear from the events of the day recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. Just as the appearance of God on Sinai was the birthday of the Jewish nation, so was the Pentecost the birth of the Christian Church.

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." - John 14:26

"So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:6-8

WHAT IS PENTECOST?

Pentecost, meaning "fiftieth" is observed only in the New Testament (Acts 2:1; Acts 20:16; 1 Corinthians 16:8). The festival so named is first spoken of in Exodus 23:16 as "the feast of harvest," and again in Exodus 34:22 as "the day of the first fruits" (Numbers 28:26). The purpose of this feast was to commemorate the completion of the grain harvest. Its distinguishing feature was the offering of "two leavened loaves" made from the new corn of the completed harvest, which, with two lambs, were waved before the Lord as an offering.

THE COMING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT ON PENTECOST SUNDAY

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians--we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." - Acts 2:1-13 ESV

The New Testament conveys the account of the Holy Ghost's descent in the Book of Acts. The apostles and a collection of over a hundred followers were assembled when a wind filled the room. "Cloven tongues" of fire emerged above the followers' heads, as they were filled with the Holy Spirit. This enabled them to speak in numerous languages, which helped in proclaiming the gospel throughout the world.

It is considered that the participants had collected to observe the Jewish festival of Shavuot, which is why the two celebrations have a close connection. Some cathedrals and churches constructed in the Middle Ages featured a Holy Ghost opening, which was a circular window in the roof. This is in honor of the Holy Ghost's entry into the room from above on Pentecost.



PENTECOST SUNDAY TRADITIONS

Celebrations of Pentecost are held seven weeks following Easter and fifty days after Passover. This befalls on a distinct date for most Eastern and Western churches, as many Eastern churches, including the Orthodox Christian Church, observe according to the Julian calendar rather than the Gregorian calendar.

Western churches observe Pentecost with many customs. Red is used in decorations to signify the fire of the Holy Spirit. Churches will also hang banners to remember the wind that hastened into the Apostles' room. The Holy Spirit may be expressed through flames, doves, pomegranates, or other sacred icons.

The religious services held for Pentecost depend on the church but mostly focus on the glorification and invocation of the Holy Spirit. Eastern Orthodox Churches recognize Pentecost as one of the Great Feasts of the Lord. On the day of Pentecost, the feast performs the Divine Liturgy, a special tradition within the Orthodox Church featuring hymns, readings, prayers, blessings, and recitations. Similar to Shavout, churches are adorned with greenery and flowers.

In many churches, baptisms are frequently completed on Pentecost, a biblical tradition for the holiday. Protestants and Catholics similarly will usually receive the Holy Communion. Churches may ordain clergy on this day or perform Confirmations, a ceremony that indicates a new Christian's testimony of faith following theological instruction.

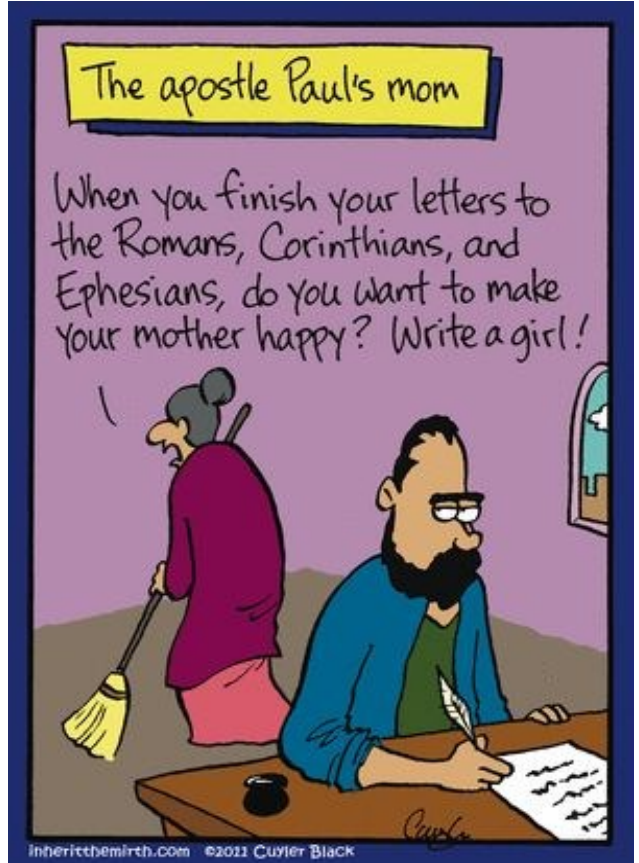
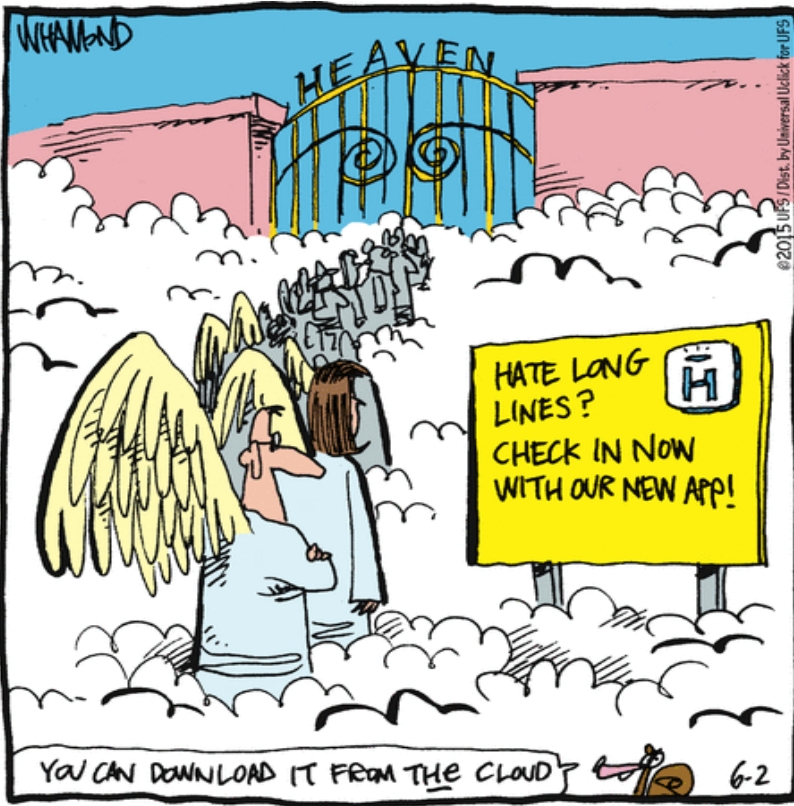

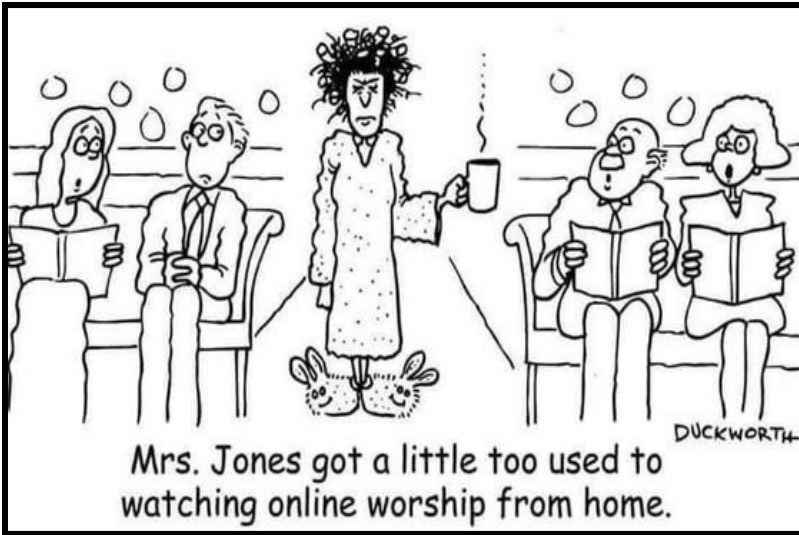
