First, we were approved for a small grant to help with our technology development that should improve our live streaming. We have addressed some of the issues, but continue to improve. What we learn at church gives us guidance on how to follow God, improve our spirituality, and live better lives.


#### 5. You gain a sense of belonging.

# Looking for a cool summer salad? Try this one. It's yummy!

#### **Avocado and Mango Salad**

This summery salad is packed with fresh flavors, including mango and avocado dressed in a chili-lime vinaigrette. It comes together in just 20 minutes, no cooking required.

#### Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 2 teaspoons agave nectar or honey
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon ancho chili powder
- 1 jalapeño, seeded and diced Kosher salt
  - Freshly ground black pepper
- 2 (10-ounce) heads of butter lettuce, washed, dried, and torn into bite-sized pieces
- 3 mangoes, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch dice
- 1/4 cup red onion, finely diced
- 1/2 cup fresh cilantro leaves
- 2 avocados, halved, pitted, and cut into 1/2-inch diced pieces

#### **Directions**

To prepare the vinaigrette, whisk together the olive oil, lime juice, agave nectar, cumin, chili powder, and jalapeño in a small mixing bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, toss the lettuce leaves, mango, red onion, and cilantro with vinaigrette.

Divide among 8 bowls and top with the avocado.






